Dear Trinity Church and friends,

Grace and Peace! As you will see in this mailer's graphic, we now turn the calendar toward our 2023-2024 Program Year that begins on Sun., Sept. 10.

Drawn from Ephesians 2:19, our Program Year's theme – "*Companions In The Household Of God*" – will shape our 2023-2024 programming. As "companions," we walk alongside each other within the life of our congregation and with our partners in the wider community. In these companionships, we devote ourselves to one another as members of a common household – a loving family of God – ministering with the gifts and graces unique to each of us, all in service of Christ's hopes for Trinity Church and for the world.

In support of our theme, we will read a portion of Paul's Letter to the Ephesians during Sunday services through Thanksgiving. Other liturgical highlights this fall will include our September sermon series exploring Christians' call to care for God's creation; the *Requiem* mass and our commemoration of All Souls on Sun., Oct. 29; festival worship on All Saints Sunday, Nov. 5; and Nigerian Thanksgiving on Nov. 26.
